- Inventory


## Six Weeks Before Moving

# **One Month Before Moving**

- Select your moving company
- Start packing and labeling
- Submit a change of address
- Update important parties:
  - Employers
  - Banks and financial institutions
  - Credit card companies
  - Local memberships or subscriptions

### Make pet plans:

- Set feeding and play routines
- Establish a quiet area
- · Check that vaccinations are up-to-date
- Research area pet laws
- Research new local vets
- Update microchip information

#### Transfer utility services:

- Electricity
- Gas
- Water
- Sewage
- Garbage collection
- Internet

## **One Week Before Moving**

- Check and refill prescriptions.
- Make plant plans.
- Schedule a final walkthrough.
- Measure entryways and stairways of the new home
- Update your address information:
  - Driver's license
  - Website and ecommerce subscriptions/ accounts
- Unplug and defrost your refrigerator.
- Double check your utility services.
- Back up your home computer.
- Confirm details with the movers.
- Withdraw some cash.

- Verify the moving truck's USDOT number.
- Take a full inventory.
- Pack tightly and secure everything.
